 - **Submit your candidacy** for an elected position on your committee or section
- 5 Contact your district medical society for leadership opportunities and to be nominated to serve on the Committee on Legislation, the Committee on Nominations, and/or Board of Trustees
 - **Collaborate with other members** and submit resolutions to the HOD
 - Offer testimony during the Interim and Annual Meetings (via online or virtual hearings) representing your committee, section, district, or yourself
